ITEM NO. G.4. – APPROVAL TO ENTER INTO A LAND DEDICATION AGREEMENT FOR KRISTEN APARTMENTS:

Cameron Johnson with AMG and Associates, an affordable housing developer, spoke regarding land owned by their agency located in Live Oak. They would like to use this land for affordable housing. Mr. Johnson said their agency would like to donate the land to the Housing Authority. He spoke regarding the creative financing options, such as Tax Credits, and the interest to partner with the Housing Authority to develop the units and manage the property.

Planning and Community Development Manager Gustavo Becerra explained all of the documents are being reviewed by attorneys. He said it is very similar to the Maple Park Phase I project. Mr. Becerra stated Tax Credit applications are very competitive.

Mr. Johnson said the project would have a 55 year regulation to keep the units affordable.

Commissioner Cleveland made a motion to approve the Property Dedication Agreement with AMG/ART, and authorize the Executive Director to execute the Agreement and any other documents necessary to carry out the terms of the Agreement. Commissioner Griese made the second. All were in favor by voice vote.

Ms. Nichols stated the Housing Authority does not have all of the experience necessary for tax credit units. This will be the Housing Authority's second tax credit property and with time and mentoring the Housing Authority will be able to take over the properties.

Mike Kelly, a representative of AMG/Pacific West Communities, explained the process of the partnership.

Commissioner Cleveland made a motion to approve the Memorandum of Agreement with Pacific West Communities, Inc., and authorize the Executive Director to execute the Agreement and any other documents necessary to carry out the terms of the Agreement. Ms. Nichols said this is the renewal of the lease for the preschool in the Richland Housing. The Yuba City Unified School District has been renting the building since 1973. The lease in the past has been a year to year lease. She stated there are a few changes in the capital improvement section.

Commissioner Lamphier had questions regarding the definitions of capital improvements and restoration. Mr. Oliveira stated there was a definition on what capital improvements are in the lease and the IRS rules would not apply to this lease because you are dealing with two public entities.

Commissioner Maan made a motion to approve the lease agreement with legal counsel edits, and authorize the Executive Director to execute the lease and any other documents necessary to carry out the terms of the lease. Commissioner Epp made the second. All were in favor by voice vote.

A RESOLUTION OF THE REGIONAL HOUSING AUTHORITY OF SUTTER AND NEVADA COUNTIES AUTHORIZING THE REFINANCING OF EXISTING DEBT AT THE KINGWOOD COMMONS APARTMENT COMPLEX

WHEREAS, the Regional Housing Authority of Sutter and Nevada Counties (the "Authority") owns the development located at 1340 Gray Avenue, Yuba City, CA 95991, otherwise known as the Kingwood Commons Apartments (the "Development"); and

WHEREAS the Authority pursuant to Articles 1 through 5 of Chapter 1 of Part 2 of Division 24 of the Health and Safety Code of the State of California (the "Act"), is authorized to borrow moneys to finance and refinance the acquisition, rehabilitation and development of housing developments to be occupied, in part, by persons and families of low and very low income residing within the jurisdiction of the Authority; and

WHEREAS, the Authority desires to refinance the existing debt comprised of Affordable Housing Agency Multi-family Housing Pool Revenue Bonds Series 2003B in order to re-amortize the current mortgage balance and lower the monthly debt service payments; and

WHEREAS, River Valley Community Bank has expressed its interest in underwriting and obtaining credit approval for the refinancing transaction according to the terms and conditions outlined in its Letter of Intent dated May 1, 2014; and

WHEREAS, the Authority hereby finds and declares that it is necessary, essential and a public purpose for the Authority to refinance the existing debt at the Development; and

WHEREAS, the Authority hereby finds and declares that this resolution is being adopted pursuant to the powers granted by the Act; and

WHEREAS, all conditions, things and acts required to exist, to have happened and to have been performed precedent to and in connection with the Authority's borrowing of the moneys contemplated by this resolution and the documents referred to herein exist, have happened and have been performed in due time, form and manner as required by the laws of the State of California, including the Act.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Regional Housing Authority of Sutter and Nevada Counties, as follows:

- **Section 1.** The Authority hereby finds and declares that the above recitals are true and correct.
- Section 2. The Authority hereby accepts the terms stipulated in the Letter dated May 1, 2014.

The Housing Authority is an equal opportunity employer and housing provider.

Section 3. All actions heretofore taken by the officers and agents of the Authority with respect to the financing contemplated by this Resolution, and the borrowing of moneys for the Development are hereby approved, confirmed and ratified, and the Executive Director of the Authority is hereby authorized, for and in the name and on behalf of the Authority, to do any and all things and take any and all actions and execute and deliver any and all certificates, agreements, assignments, notes and other documents which are necessary or advisable in order to carry out the purposes of the proposed refinancing, including but not limited to those certificates, agreements, assignments, notes and other documents as may be necessary to further the purposes hereof.

Section 4. This resolution shall take effect from and after its adoption.

Background

The Regional Housing Authority of Sutter and Nevada Counties (Housing Authority) manages many different programs for multiple jurisdictions. Staff needs are defined by the workload of their department. Due to a decrease in the workload for the Development and Rehab Specialist in the Planning and Community Development Department, this position was transferred to the Maintenance Department as a Maintenance Mechanic II. The Maintenance Mechanic II position salary is lower than that of the Development and Rehab Specialist.

Per the MOU:

XXII. PAY ADJUSTMENTS/ CLASSIFICATION/COMPENSATION STUDIES

A. <u>Y-Rates</u>:

Whenever, without the fault or inability on the part of an employee, such employee would suffer an actual decrease in salary as a result of action taken by RHASNC, the Board may adopt a Y-rate to apply to the employee so affected. An employee whose compensation has been established at a Y-rate shall not receive any cost-of-living adjustments and shall remain at the Y-rate until the fifth step of the range established for his or her class exceeds the Y-rate. An employee receiving longevity pay whose compensation has been established at a Y-rate shall not receive any cost-of-living adjustments and shall remain in the Y-rate until the longevity pay for the range established for his or her class exceeds the Y-rate.



Due to the classification change, the Housing Authority, along with the approval from the Sutter-Yuba Employees Association, Local #1, is requesting that this position be Y-Rated.

Recommendation

Staff recommends that the Board of Commissioners of the Regional Housing Authority of Sutter and Nevada Counties approve the Y-Rate of John Guanzon, Maintenance Mechanic II as provided in the Memorandum of Understanding.
