RHA currently has partnered with other organizations to develop Permanent Supportive Housing (PSH) projects in three of its four-county jurisdictions, with additional units in the pipeline, providing housing to 119 households who were experiencing homelessness. Supportive service providers are under contract to incorporate wrap around services for the residents at each project. Currently RHA through its partnerships will add an additional 15 units of affordable housing in 2024.
